



## 75 years of college heritage inspires the design of a new LLRC

**Fullerton College LLRC Requirements:** Fullerton College required the design of their new LLRC (Library Learning Resource Center) to adapt to the campus' historic Hispanic Moresque architecture style, by having both the exterior and the interior of the building follow this style. Fullerton College also aspired to create a studious, "higher education" look, which would give the school's library a more serious tone.

**IOS Solutions:** The 68,000 sq. ft. facility was completely furnished by Interior Office Solutions, utilizing custom furniture and several manufacturers specific to higher education. Interior Office Solutions coordinated the design, planning and delivery of over \$2.2 million worth of furniture for the new LLRC. Included in the product were library book stacks, study carrels, faculty offices, conference rooms, computer labs, skills labs, math labs, classrooms and tutor rooms. The custom furniture's Hispanic Moresque style and decorative steel grills integrate closely with the buildings exterior architectural elements.
